#### Comments:

Burdekin mills crushed just under 390,000 tonnes this week. Throughput was down overall due to an unplanned stop at Inkerman that extended to 44 hours. Kalamia and Pioneer mills however achieved the highest weekly throughput for the season to date.

Just over 45% of the forecast 8.15M tonne Burdekin crop has been crushed to date.

The average weekly CCS was 14.41, which was slightly down on the previous week although the trend is still upwards.

The highest CCS sample was 17.5 from a rake of Q240-P in the Lower Clare productivity district.

With school holidays commencing at the end of this week, parents and carers are urged to remind children of the dangers associated with cane trains. Children should keep well away from the cane rail network and never play on or around cane bins.
