Comments:

The Burdekin mills crushed more than 416,000 tonnes this week, the highest throughput for the season to date. All four mills exceeded budget with Pioneer recording a new season high of just below 88,000 tonnes.

No major unplanned stops were recorded last week. Three mills will be carrying out cleans this week.

A total of 5.24M tonnes, just under 65% of the forecast 8.15M tonne Burdekin crop, has been crushed to date.

The average weekly CCS was 14.8, which was up on the previous week. The average weekly CCS is still trending upwards, however remains below the weekly budget.

The highest CCS sample of 18.4 was a rake of Q240 – 2R in the Stockham Rd productivity area.

As the season progresses we urge those working in the harvesting sector to take extra care around cane rail corridors.

We have seen a number of collisions and near hits involving harvesting equipment and other machinery over recent weeks.

With a third of the season still remaining, we remind people to avoid becoming complacent as cane trains cannot swerve or come to a quick stop.
