Comments:

The Burdekin mills crushed just under 125,000 tonnes of cane for the week.

Wet weather impacted throughput at all three operational mills, however Pioneer was the most affected with crushing operations unable to recommence until Friday morning.

Just under 99 per cent of the forecast 8.20M tonne Burdekin crop has been crushed to date.

The remaining cane continues to grow on with the wet and humid conditions.

The average weekly CCS was 10.64, with the season-todate CCS now sitting on 13.65 units. CCS levels have continued to fall as the season runs on and the wet weather continues.

The highest CCS sample of 14.2 was from a rake of Q183-3R in the Causeway Productivity district.

Crushing is expected to continue into early January. Cane trains will continue to run throughout this period so road users are reminded to keep their train brains switched on.
