Comments:

The Burdekin mills processed just over 64,000 tonnes of cane for the week.

Invicta, Kalamia and Inkerman mills restarted after the previous week's wet weather only to be stopped again mid-week following heavy monsoonal rain. Kalamia and Inkerman mills have now been closed due to inadequate supply of cane. Invicta and Pioneer mills will remain open and supply options will be reassessed after Christmas.

The season-to-date total is now 7.71M tonnes, which represents 94 per cent of the Burdekin region's crop forecast of 8.20M tonnes.

The average weekly CCS was 10.28, which is well below budget due to the wet weather and reduced cane quality.

The highest CCS, of 14.6, was from rakes of Q240 5R in the Stockham Rd (INV) productivity district.

During these school holidays, parents and carers are asked to remind children of the dangers of playing on or near the rail network. It may be quiet now, but mills will be starting up again after Christmas.
