#### Comments:

Rain impacted harvesting across the region in the latter part of the week, particularly in the Inkerman and Invicta areas.

Throughput for the week was just under 378,000 tonnes which is the second highest for the season to date, despite lost time from weather, unplanned stops and a scheduled clean at Inkerman.

CCS came in just below budget this week. The highest CCS recorded for the week was 17.3 from a rake of Q240 Plant, in the Haughton productivity district.

There were a number of concerning incidents last week in which members of the public interfered with our cane railway infrastructure. This caused damage to our infrastructure and bin derailments, and could have caused serious injury to our loco operators.

While most people take our cane safety messages seriously, it is disappointing that some are putting our cane trains and our people at risk.

Parents and carers are again asked to speak to their children about the importance of staying clear of the cane railway system, and to report any suspicious activities to the police.
