Comments:

An excellent performance from the milling, harvesting and transport sectors saw over 90,000 tonnes crushed for the week, approximately 12,400 tonnes above forecast.

Light showers occurred mid-week, with minimal impact on harvesting. Unusually heavy fog on Thursday morning temporarily disrupted harvesting and transport operations.

Average CCS levels have decreased to 13.64 units, 0.52 units less than the previous week.

Average bin weights also fell last week, coming in 0.17 tonnes under the season-to-date average.

The highest CCS sample was 16.10 units from a rake of Q208 ratoon in the Kelsey Creek Productivity District.

With the crushing season extending into the school holidays, we ask parents and caregivers to talk to children about the dangers of playing on or around our cane rail network.

Do not linger near any part of the rail network, and only cross the line using designated crossings.

Remember our locos are towing heavy loads and can take up to 1km to come to a complete stop.

Our cane trains are in operation around the clock, seven days a week during the crushing season, including over the holiday period.
