Comments:

Despite rainfall hampering operations, 81,200 tonnes were crushed for the week. This was about 4,000 tonnes above budget and represents a fantastic effort from all sectors of the industry.

Daily rainfall since the latter half of last week has continued to impact operations, but is expected to start clearing from mid-week onwards.

Average weekly CCS still came in at 0.61 units above budget, although it was starting to decline towards the end of the week with the ongoing wet conditions.

The highest CCS sample for Week 5 was 16.57 from a rake of ratoon KQ228 in the Gunyarra productivity district.

During the week our cane train drivers reported children in school uniform walking along our cane rail network towards a train bridge. This was reported to the relevant school. I urge all parents and caregivers to speak to their children about the dangers of walking along our cane rail network.

Please remember to use your train brain and always take care around our cane rail network. Our cane trains are working around the clock, seven days a week.
