Proserpine Mill processed more than 91,200 tonnes of cane for the week.

This was more than 5,000 tonnes above budget, reflecting a fantastic effort from all sectors of the industry.

Proserpine Mill has officially passed the halfway mark, with more than 50 per cent of their estimated 1.75 million tonne crop processed for the season to date.

Average weekly CCS has increased again, coming in at 14.77 units. This was under budget, but only by a narrow margin. A large proportion of standover is currently being processed, which is affecting the average CCS figure.

The highest CCS was 17.05 units from a rake of plant Q208 in the Kelsey Creek productivity district.

With school holidays still under way, parents and guardians are reminded to talk to their children about the dangers of playing on or near our cane rail network.
